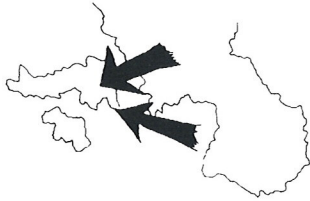


Butterfly Facts

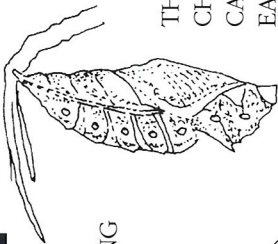
THE RED ADMIRAL
THE BUTTERFLIES WE SEE IN BRITAIN BEFORE JULY HAVE FLOWN IN FROM THE CONTINENT.



THE BUTTERFLY IS VERY ACTIVE, PATROLLING ITS TERRITORY, SUCH AS A SECTION OF HEDGE, AND CHASING OFF INTRUDERS.



THE CHRYsalis CAN BE EASILY RECOGNISED BY THE GOLD SPOTS ON ITS SIDE.



THE STRIKING BLACK, WHITE AND RED PATTERN REMINDED EARLY NATURALISTS OF THE ROBES OF NOBLEMEN.



THEY ARE A FREQUENT VISITOR TO GARDEN MICHAELMAS DAISIES, FEEDING ON THE NECTAR AND SUNNING THEMSELVES.
